



TENT INSTALLATION AGREEMENT

Permits & Licenses. Event Holder/Renter is responsible for obtaining, at their own expense, any and all governmentally required tenting permits, licenses and other consents no less than 3 working days prior to scheduled tent installation. Angelo Events & Tents (AE&T) will, upon request, provide a flame retardancy certificate to Event Holder/Renter or their designee.

Site Preparation. Event Holder/Renter is responsible for cleaning and clearing the tent site prior to AE&T's arrival. The Event Holder/Renter (or his / her designated representative) must be present at the time of tent erection or **MUST CLEARLY MARK OR LAY OUT THE EXACT INSTALLATION LOCATION.** AE&T staff is explicitly prohibited from proceeding with an installation where there is doubt or uncertainty as to the installation location. A **RELOCATION CHARGE (EQUAL TO 30% OF THE TENT COST) WILL BE ASSESSED IF A TENT IS MOVED OR RELOCATED.**

Staking. Event Holder/Renter is responsible for contacting the appropriate authorities (BY CALLING 1-800-DIG-TESS) at least seventy-two (72) hours before tent installation is scheduled. The Event Holder/Renter is responsible for a) obtaining authorization to drive tent stakes or otherwise disturb soil; b) obtaining information regarding underground utilities (e.g. phone lines, gas lines, cable lines, septic systems, etc.), and/or c) obtaining information regarding any other conditions that may interfere with tent erection

Water Barrels as Anchors. Industry experience has shown that the best way to erect a tent on asphalt or concrete is driving stakes or using concrete anchors, and later filling and patching the holes. Some customers insist that water barrels be used as anchors, instead of stakes, to avoid damaging asphalt or other hard surfaces. This practice is not recommended. An Event Holder/Renter who insists on barreled installation assumes all liability for personal injury, property damage and related risks.

Weather Related Risks. Tents are temporary structures and could possibly collapse during high winds or heavy rains. Evacuation of tents under these conditions, or when lightning is present, is recommended. By accepting tent installation, the Event Holder/Renter agrees that, in the event of predicted or actual storm conditions, AE&T may dismantle any previously installed tent (s) and related items in the interest of personal safety and property protection.

Risk of Loss or Damage. The Event Holder/Renter is responsible for any tent (or tents) from the time of erection to the time of retrieval. Any tent lost or stolen while in the Event Holder's/Renter's care must be replaced at the Event Holder's/Renter's expense. Tent damage which occurs, except a result of a natural disturbance (e.g. tornado, hail, fire caused by lightning, etc.) must be repaired at the Event Holder's/Renter's expense.

Hold Harmless Provisions. By accepting tent erection and installation, an Event Holder/Renter assumes the risk of, and stipulates that he / she / they shall indemnify and hold harmless Angelo Events & Tents from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits and proceedings of every kind, including costs, expenses, and attorney's fees for personal injury or property damage caused by, connected with or resulting from, but not necessarily limited to the following: (a) the delivery, loading, unloading, erection, installation, dismantling and use of the rented tent (s) and related items (s); (b) contact with underground wires, pipes, cables or other obstructions and (c) necessary surface repairs.
